Subject: Student Access to Computing Resources

I am pleased to forward for your information the enclosed policy framework and planning implementation guidelines related to student access to computing resources. The plan and guidelines were developed by the CSU Commission on Learning Resources and Instructional Technology (CLRIT) and approved by the Technology Steering Committee.

The goal is to enable all CSU students to have 24-hour access to a personal computer and to the network by the fall of the year 2000. As the first step toward that end, every campus is expected to study the issues and to submit an implementation plan by the end of an 18th month period beginning July 1, 1995.

Four campuses have to date requested and received authorization to proceed with pilot implementation of a student access requirement in the coming academic year. These campuses – Sonoma State University, California Polytechnic State University, San Luis Obispo, Humboldt State University and California State University, Northridge – have agreed to inform other campuses in the system of what they learn as they work through the issues and the challenges. They will provide periodic progress reports and ready access to persons centrally involved in the effort.

Campuses wishing to begin implementation during July 1995 through December 1996 may plan to do so. Plans should be prepared using the guidelines and be submitted to the Technology Steering Committee for review and comment. Plans and/or questions should be directed to Assistant Vice Chancellor Thomas W. West, 310/985-9406. We expect all campuses to develop and submit plans by January 31, 1997.
